Design Public Hearing

The Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT) welcomes you to the Design Public Hearing for the proposed Fall Line Trail – Northern Section, which involves the development of the northernmost 4.8 miles of a shared-use path that will connect the proposed Longdale Phase of the Fall Line Trail in Henrico County to the existing Trolley Line Trail in the Town of Ashland. The trail will begin at the Woodman Road extension, approximately 0.2 miles south of Winfrey Road in Henrico County, and extend to a 0.46-mile section of the existing Trolley Line Trail, traveling along Walder Lane to Ashcake Road, in the Town of Ashland


This public hearing is held to provide an opportunity for any person, acting on their own behalf or representing a group or governing agency, to give the department their comments and/or suggestions concerning the proposed project after reviewing the project information.

Representatives from VDOT are on hand to discuss the project and answer your questions. It is the responsibility of VDOT to ensure that all members of the community are afforded the opportunity to participate in public decisions on transportation systems and projects affecting them.

A comment sheet is included in the meeting materials and your input is encouraged. All oral and written comments received will be included in a transcript for review by VDOT personnel, interested citizens and all other interested parties. Concerns raised as a result of this meeting will be evaluated by staff prior to consideration for approval of the project by the Chief Engineer.

Project Description



Cost – \$17.5 million

Purpose – To provide increased bicycle and pedestrian connectivity to existing and planned trail networks, as well as key local and regional destinations, by constructing a 4.8-mile section of the Fall Line Trail.

From – 0.2 miles south of Winfrey Road

To - Ashcake Road

Total length – 4.8 miles

Improvements – Shared-use trail facility along abandoned railways and existing utility transmission corridors, including a new bicycle and pedestrian bridge over the Chickahominy River.

The existing Ashland Trolley Line Trail.

Project Description

The Fall Line Trail is a regional paved shared-use path that is planned to span seven localities and connect rural, suburban, and urban landscapes and a multitude of places of interest for approximately 43 miles in the Richmond region from the City of Petersburg to the Town of Ashland.

The Fall Line Trail – Northern Section will complete the northernmost segments of the Fall Line Trail and will provide a new 4.8 mile separated ten-foot (10') shared-use path to connect the Longdale Section of the Fall Line Trail, which is currently under design and development by Henrico County, to the existing Trolley Line Trail in the Town of Ashland. The limits of the project are from the Woodman Road extension, approximately 0.2 miles south of Winfrey Road in Henrico County, to the existing Trolley Line Trail, which extends approximately 0.46 miles north along Walder Lane to Ashcake Road in the Town of Ashland.


The Fall Line Trail – Northern Section will follow the historic Richmond-Ashland Trolley Line corridor for approximately

4.3 miles, primarily along an existing property owned by Dominion Energy Virginia.

On October 25, 2022, the Virginia Commonwealth Transportation Board (CTB), the governing board for the Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT), resolved to adopt the location decision to accept the Fall Line Trail project into the state transportation system. This decision is consistent with the Code of Virginia (§33.2-208) and the Virginia Administrative Code (24 VAC 30-380-10) and allows the project to move forward to design, advertisement, and construction.

VDOT has prepared a conceptual design for the project, which is being presented at tonight's Design Public Hearing. Detailed design and construction of the project is expected to occur through a Design-Build project procurement method. Following the review and input of public comments received, VDOT anticipates that a Design-Build contract will be advertised in late 2022.

Environmental Review

As federal funding will not be used for the Fall Line Trail – Northern Section, an environmental review, consistent with the Federal Highway Administration's implementing regulations under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (23 CFR §771), is not required.

The Fall Line Trail – Northern Section will be coordinated with appropriate federal, state, and local agencies as part of the environmental review and approvals required throughout the project development process.

All required environmental clearances and permits will be obtained prior to construction. Strict compliance with all environmental conditions and commitments resulting from regulatory approvals, in addition to adherence to VDOT's specifications and standard best practices, will minimize impacts to the environment during construction.
