Chatham Bridge Today




- Built in 1941 (79 Years Old)
- 16,000 vehicles a day
- Travel lanes 4 lanes, each 10 feet wide
- Narrow sidewalks (4 feet wide)
- Structurally deficient
 - Asphalt in poor condition due to age
 - Impacts to travelers
 - High maintenance costs
 - Weight Posting




Project Schedule

Phase	Date
Dixon Street ramp improvements Install detour signs (covered until needed)	Complete!
Utility relocation	Completion by June 15
Construction activity begins	May 28, 2020
Bridge closes to all traffic Demolition work begins	June 2020* (*exact date to be announced two weeks ahead)
Bridge reopens to traffic	16.5 months after closure (incentivized completion schedule)



Detour Route




- Route 3 Business
- Blue & Gray Parkway

Remember:

No change for traffic approaching downtown from Route 1 at Falmouth Bridge, or Route 3 from Interstate 95



Detour: Vehicles taller than 13 feet, 6 inches

No change for traffic approaching downtown from Route 1 at Falmouth Bridge, or Route 3 from Interstate 95




Dixon Street Ramp Improvements: Complete








Hanson Avenue and Route 1 Traffic Pattern Changes





River User Rules of Road

- Follow warning buoys
- Do not approach pipes
- Do not enter the workzone
- Use caution during high flows
- Intermittent short term closures (<24 hours) will be required for beam demolition and setting and deck forming.

Construction Sequence Highlights

Construction Activity	Approximate Timeframe
Access road and causeway construction Traffic signal modifications at Route 1, Hanson Avenue Detour sign	Late May and Early June 2020 Causeway construction continuing into July
Bridge Deck Demolition	June – July 2020 (estimated 3 weeks)
Steel Beam Demolition	Early August 2020
Top of river pier demolition and widening Shore foundations and supports Foundation protection in river	Late August 2020



Construction Sequence Highlights

Construction Activity	Approximate Timeframe
Placement of new structural steel	December 2020
Bridge deck forming and placement	Spring 2021
Bridge rail forming and placement	Summer 2021
Bridge deck finishing, traffic elements and new signs BRIDGE OPENS!	Early October 2021


